What's Blooming at the Library: May Program Highlights from Nature Walks to the Friends' Spring Book Sale

Ellsworth, Maine – This May, the Ellsworth Public Library is pleased to announce a wide range of programs, many of them focused on the beauty and wonder of Maine nature, including Zoe Weil's talk "Maine Wonders" on May 8 at 5 PM, forest bathing sessions with Shep Erhard starting May 19, the library's May art show "Maine's Quiet Beauty" featuring photographs by Dietra Semple, Ms. Jean's Mer-May! Storytime on May 17 at 11 AM, and a chance to connect with Friends of Acadia who will share information on volunteer opportunities on May 31.

Additionally, the public is invited to the launch of the recently released publication "Inside Out: Art and Writing by Residents of the Hancock County Jail" in the Riverview Room on May 24 at 10 AM, and an informational session led by the League of Women Voters of Maine about Local Government and how to participate in it on May 17 at 1 PM.

The Ellsworth Public Library is also launching a new monthly program: "The Friendship Group" is a social group for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities and will meet on the first Tuesday of each month at 10 AM. The first meeting will be on May 6 in the Knitting Corner of the library.

Lastly, the Friends of the Ellsworth Public Library will host a three-day book sale on the following days: Thursday, May 15 from 1:30 PM to 5 PM, Friday, May 16 from 9 AM to 4 PM, and Saturday, May 17 from 9 AM - 1 PM. There will be books and more for all ages and interests—available by donation (cash or check only) unless otherwise marked. The Friends use all proceeds to support library programs, services, and special projects that benefit the whole community.

When she's not writing and giving talks about becoming solutionaries through her work as the President of the <u>Institute for Humane Education</u>, Zoe is usually exploring nature with her three dogs, while photographing and videotaping Maine wonders. She has given six TEDx talks including her acclaimed TEDx, <u>The World Becomes What You Teach</u>.

She is the author of eight books, including her 2024 #1 Amazon new release in Social Philosophy, <u>The Solutionary Way</u>, Amazon #1 Best Seller in the Philosophy and Social Aspects of Education, *The World Becomes What We Teach*, and Nautilus silver medal winner *Most Good*, *Least Harm*. Zoe was named one of *Maine Magazine*'s 50 independent leaders transforming their communities and the state and is the recipient of the Unity College "Women in

About Shep Erhart:

Shep Erhart is a certified Forest Therapy Guide. Shep and Linnette Erhart founded Maine Coast Sea Vegetables in 1971 in their farmhouse kitchen, inspired by a pot of miso soup that was

especially delicious. They realized that the soups' full, rich flavor came from the wild Alaria they had gathered from the shores of the Schoodic Peninsula, and they soon began sharing their Atlantic Wakame and other wild-harvested sea vegetables with friends and neighbors. At the time, few other folks were harvesting and selling seaweed in Maine, and within a few years, the Erharts built one of the most recognized and trusted brands in the industry.

Today, Maine Coast Sea Vegetables is an employee-owned company operating out of a modern processing plant in Hancock, Maine. Every year, their team of over twenty people sorts, packs, and ships several hundred thousand pounds of sea vegetables to customers all across the United States (& Canada). They pride themselves on being able to offer reliable and trustworthy information on the nutritional, health, culinary, and environmental benefits of North American sea vegetables.

The public is invited to attend this book launch and reading of the recently released publication "Inside Out: Art and Writing by Residents of the Hancock County Jail" in the Riverview Room.

Over the course of the past 20 years, residents of the Hancock County Jail generated mixed media art pieces and creative writing in which they conveyed their thoughts, ideas, and insights in an evocative and engaging manner.

These inmates are our neighbors, family, friends, and community members. It is the purpose of this project to enlighten, encourage, and inspire members of the public with images and stories of growth, acceptance, and healing. The written and visual art created by the residents of the Hancock County Jail conveys the humanity of the artists and elicits feelings of empathy, hope, and understanding.

The Inside Out Anthology is a diverse collection of original artwork and writing by over 50 Hancock County Jail inmates, which will be distributed to correctional facilities, rehabilitation centers, and public libraries throughout the state. The intention is to educate the public about the effects of incarceration in an authentic, thoughtful, and impactful way.

Activities used to generate content for the Inside Out anthology can easily be duplicated by other programs/organizations; a list of resources will appear in the book's appendix.

based job training program for older Americans. Authorized and funded by Title V of the Older Americans Act, the program provides training for low-income, unemployed seniors over the age of 55. SCSEP participants gain work experience in a variety of community service activities at 501(c)(3) non-profits and public facilities, including schools, hospitals, day-care centers, and senior centers. These agencies provide job skills training and help participants in their job search efforts. Participants train 20 hours per week while earning minimum wage.
